September 17 Woodstock v. Calhoun Advance

WOODSTOCK, GA – The Woodstock Wolverines and Head Coach Troy Hoff are looking to notch their first win of the season against the Calhoun Yellow Jackets on Friday.

Kickoff is at 7:30 p.m. at Woodstock High School.

Although the Wolverines are off to a sluggish 0-4 start this year, Hoff hopes that the Wolverines can show what they are made of against Calhoun.

“We want to go out and compete,” Hoff said. “We want to be in position to make plays and be competitive in the game to give ourselves a chance.”

Though this a non-region game, the Wolverines are looking to turn things around as all five of their games after Calhoun are region games and they are still looking at a zero in the win column.

“Calhoun traditionally, year-in and year-out, have one of the best programs in the state,” said Hoff, looking forward to the matchup. “It’s hard sometimes for kids to see [that their hard work is paying off when they look at the scoreboard], but through practice and the things we are getting better at, we’re working on the become a better football team.”

The Wolverines will try to ride the energy coming from their 7-21 loss against Campbell High School last week, Woodstock’s closest game of the season. It was also only the second game in which Woodstock scored a touchdown in this season.

That touchdown came off a pick-six from linebacker Preston Lawrence in which he intercepted Campbell quarterback Luke Marble’s pass and returned the ball 28 yards into the endzone.

As Coach Hoff mentioned, Calhoun will not be an easy opponent for the Wolverines, as the Yellow Jackets are coming off a 56-7 win against Ridgeland High School off the back of five passing touchdowns and three rushing.

It will be a difficult task for the Wolverines, no doubt, as their defense has given up an average of 36.5 points per game over their first four games while the offense has scored only three touchdowns total this season.
